From the serene Stockholm archipelago's 'magic season' to the excitement of a Gotland truffle hunt, and from intimate encounters sleeping amongst reindeer to the simple joy of celebrating Sweden's cinnamon bun day, Sweden offers a diverse array of experiences that cater to every taste. To discover this truly special time of year, here are 'Sweden's Top 10 Autumn Experiences' – a curated guide showcasing the very best of what this captivating country has to offer in its most magical season.

[Sleep Amongst the Reindeer in Swedish Lapland](#) – A Unique Nature Stay from Kaatis Reindeers through to 30th September.

Go car-free and enjoy a calm autumn getaway on the island of Styrösö in the Gothenburg archipelago, staying at the **brand new [Kusthotellet](#)**, opening 30th Aug.

[Watch the Northern Lights without the cold and snow](#) in Swedish Lapland - the best time to view the northern lights is between September and late March, although we have viewed them as early as late August.

Stay at: The [best place to see the Northern Lights](#) is Abisko. Stay at [STF Abisko Mountain Station](#).

Hike the new [Stockholm Archipelago Trail](#) and experience the archipelago's 'magic season' -Between mid-August and the end of September, we call it "The Magic Season" in the archipelago. This is because the water temperature and nature are about 2 weeks behind the mainland... this means that the springs are colder, but autumn is an extension of summer in the archipelago. It's also about the nights getting darker, the stars being visible again in a darker sky. It is different from the constant light nights of summer. And nature shifts to a shimmering colour palette.... There's also a wonderful calm that spreads across the archipelago when all Stockholmers return home after the more hectic 7 weeks of summer holidays. It is a lovely calm (the Ingemar Bergman-esque beautiful Swedish melancholy) that rolls in... The humidity between warm days and colder nights also produces mists that create a special magic... Stay at: Sandhamn is probably the most famous place in the Stockholm archipelago, known for its bustling life and the beautiful houses. Stay at [Sandhamn Seglarhotell](#), which dates back to the 19th century when the building was inaugurated by King Oscar II as the clubhouse of the Royal Swedish Yacht Club.

4 October - The Swedish [Cinnamon Bun Day](#) ('Kanelbullens dag') – The perfect time to experience Swedish [mys](#), the art of cosiness, while also taking time for a Swedish [fika](#). Book a city break to either Malmö, Gothenburg or Stockholm to explore the many wonderful coffee shops, at a time of year when everyone is competing to make the best cinnamon, or do you perhaps prefer cardamon buns? 10-11 Oct - Swedish Cheese Festival ('Ostfestivalen') in Gothenburg -[Swedish Cheese Festival](#) is a homage to fromage – it gathers thousands of cheese lovers every year. You'll be able to taste samples, watch celebrity chefs compete in making the best cheese dishes and buy your favourite cheeses. If you're looking for something extra, book a cheese safari where you'll learn more about the history of some exhibitors while tasting the expert's favourite cheeses.

Location: Auktionsverket Kulturarena in central Gothenburg.

Stay at: The **NEW** Hyatt Place Gothenburg Central, which opened in April 2025

7-9 Nov - Stockholm Food & Wine - Taste, smell, talk, listen and learn at one of the Nordic's largest combined food and beverage fairs. As a bonus, [Sthlm Food & Wine](#) it's held on the same date and location as the pastry and chocolate festival 'Bak- och Chokladfestivalen'.

Location: Stockholmsmässan in Älvsjö, outside Stockholm.

Stay at: [Stockholm Stadshotell](#), Södermalm. **Opened January 2025**, 13 min away by tube.

14-16 Nov - Gotland Truffle Festival ('Gotlands Tryffelfestival') - This festival is dedicated to the [Gotlandic truffle](#) and is the finale of the Gotland Truffle Month, which takes place in October/November. There will be seminars on truffles, a truffle market, truffle hunts, a truffle ceremony and special truffle menus at many restaurants in Visby. Location: Various places throughout Visby and Gotland.

Stay at: [Sibbjäns NEW hotel](#) accommodation opening Summer 2025, the hottest thing on Gotland right now.
